Parenting for Faith



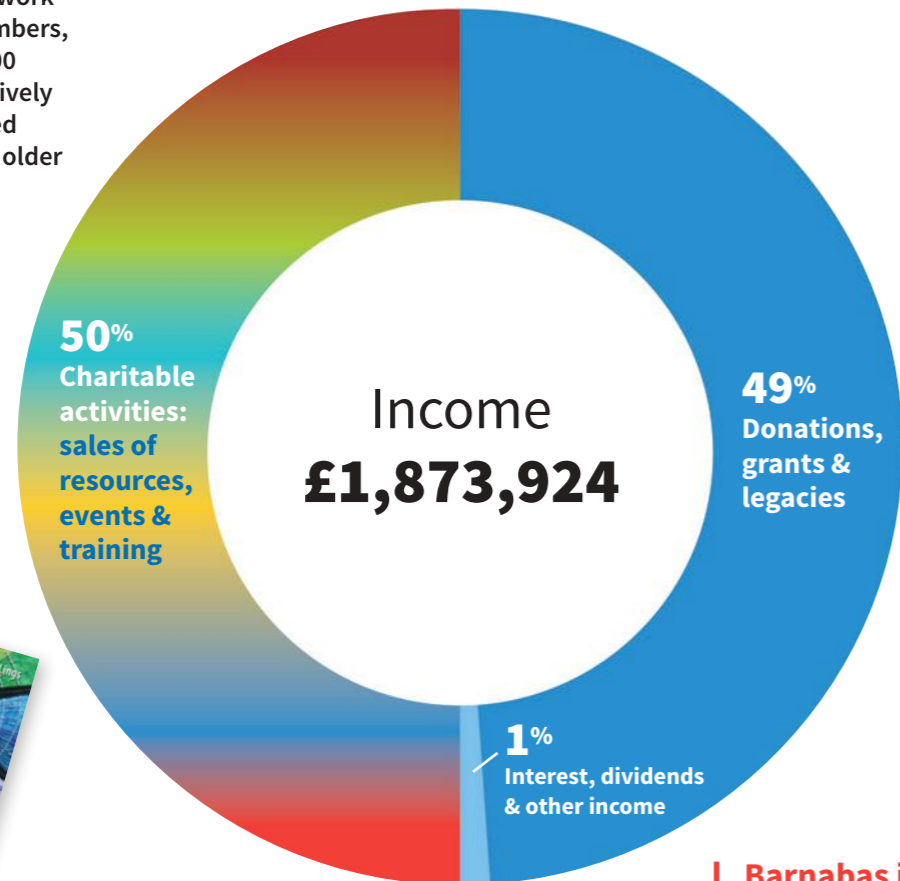
Nearly 5,000 Parenting for Faith course videos streamed, 48,000 website visits and collaborations with New Wine, the Salvation Army and the Methodist Church

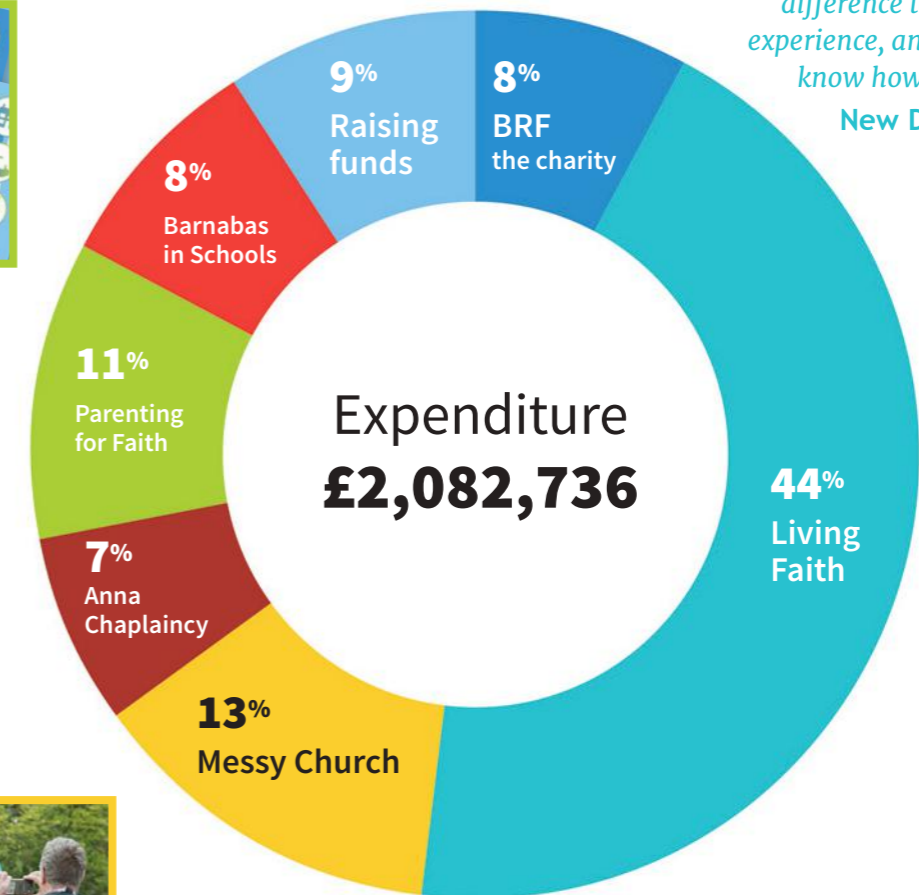

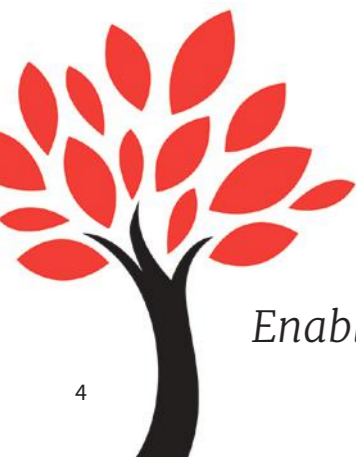
