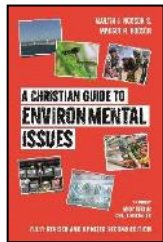

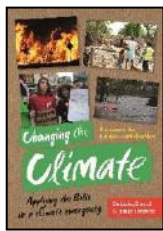

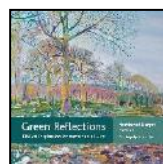
Holy Habits Bible Reflections: Sharing resources: 40 readings and reflections

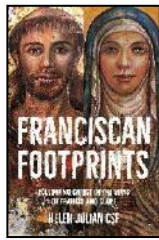

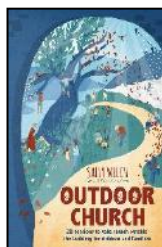




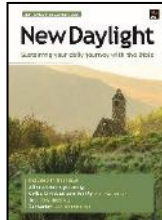
