About Messy Church

Messy Church is a way of being church for families and others. It is Christ-centred, for all ages, and based on creativity, hospitality and celebration. From its tiny beginnings in Cowplain, near Portsmouth, there are now more than 3,750 Messy Churches in 30 countries.

Some serious misconceptions about Messy Church persist in both church and media, the most common being that Messy Church is somewhere to entertain the kids and is solely a way to get people 'back into (real) church'. What Messy Church is...

• Messy Church is a form of church for children and adults that involves creativity, celebration and hospitality. All elements are for, and should include, people of all ages, adults and children.

- It's primarily for people who don't already belong to another form of church.
- It's fun.

• It's a church for people at all stages of their faith journey and of any age – a congregation that is as valuable and worthy of investment as any other congregation.

It works!

Two major evaluations of the work of Messy Church have confirmed the impact the movement is having. While the church as a whole has seen a decline in numbers, Messy Church has enabled many congregations to reach out to families and their communities. *Playfully Serious* (February 2019) and a follow-up study *A Voyage of Discovery: Deepening discipleship in Messy Churches and beyond* (May 2021), carried out by the respected Church Army Research Unit (CARU), confirms the effectiveness of Messy Church in deepening the faith, confidence and commitment of its leaders and members. Looking ahead

An exciting new season for Messy Church lies ahead as BRF continues to invest in the development and growth of the movement. A key priority will be to provide support, help and advice to Messy Church leaders and their teams who are restarting their Messy Churches after the disruption caused by the pandemic, as well as to those who are starting Messy Churches for the first time. The third Messy Church International Conference in May 2022 will bring leaders together from around the world. We continue to develop Messy Church Goes Wild, the movement within Messy Church which encourages Messy Churches to meet God outdoors, to love the natural world, to experience a sense of awe and wonder there and to be more eco-aware in all we do as gathered church, for the good of the planet. And we look forward to the appointment of Lucy's successor to lead the Messy Church movement in this new season.

About Lucy Moore

A secondary school teacher by training, Lucy Moore is the pioneer and founder of Messy Church. She has been responsible for developing the work of Messy Church nationally and internationally – writing, speaking, reflecting and developing Messy projects such as Messy Church Goes Wild. She has written many of the Messy Church books and continues to help lead Messy Church in her own church. She is part of the Leadership Community of Fresh Expressions, a member of the College of Evangelists and has represented her diocese in the House of Laity at General Synod.

As she bids BRF goodbye, Lucy comments

'It's been a tremendously exciting couple of decades, working at BRF to nurture Messy Church around the world and across denominations. Seeing God at work through local churches, helping lay as well as ordained leaders to grow teams, make disciples, work out how to be church in an imaginative way for people who wouldn't easily join in with church: it has all been such a privilege. I'm grateful for the inspired people I've worked with, for the generosity of those who have supported the ministry and to BRF for enabling the work to happen.'
