

## Sharing the Easter Story From reading to living the gospel Sally Welch

In BRF's 2022 Lent book Sally Welch takes up our centenary theme of 'sharing the story' and applies it to the events leading up to Easter. She leads her reader on a

journey through the Bible, illuminating familiar and unfamiliar passages, showing how 'sharing the story' requires listening, reflecting, living and telling: 'Once we have told it,' she writes, 'the story is shared. We become part of a community of storytellers, of good news givers, or children of the gospel. Then we may become the story we reflect upon, live and share.'

Written for both individuals and groups, each chapter ends with thought-provoking questions and prayer. There are guidelines for group leaders, and information about 'Journeymakers', seven downloadable PDFs to take out on Lenten walks which will be available on the BRF <u>Resource hub</u>.
