In 2020 Living Faith became the name which captured the five series of Bible reading notes, the annual publishing programme and events focused on the areas of Bible reading, prayer, spirituality and discipleship.



Living Faith encourages people of all ages to go deeper in prayer and in their relationship with God, and enables them to grow as Christian disciples, wherever they are on their spiritual journey.

Anna Chaplaincy

Offering spiritual care in later life



Founded in 2010 by Debbie Thrower in Alton, Hampshire, Anna Chaplaincy became part of BRF when other churches wanted to adopt the same approach to older people's ministry.

Today, BRF's Anna Chaplaincy team supports a growing network of nearly 200 Anna Chaplains and 1,500 volunteers, who offer spiritual care and support to older people.

BRF's support for the network includes training, resources, residential events, forums, meet-ups and consultancy.

The early years The Fellowship of St. IRatthew.

1922

The Fellowship of St Matthew is founded by Revd Leslie Mannering in Brixton. The first daily Bible reading notes are published on 1 January 1922.

1926

The Fellowship of St Matthew is renamed The Bible Reading Fellowship. Monthly circulation reaches 1,500 copies.



1929

Monthly circulation reaches 20,000 per issue.



At the start of World War II, a special services edition of BRF notes is produced. By the end of the war, readership has increased by 80,000.

1924

Other churches in Southwark Diocese start using BRF notes and circulation reaches 500 copies per month.

1927

At a retreat in Carshalton, Surrey, to discuss BRF's future, it is agreed that 'the Spirit must have free play'. 1930

BRF appoints Miss Margery Sykes as its first employee.



Milestones

1947

BRF celebrates its silver jubilee at an event attended by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother. In her address she testifies to using BRF notes herself.



1961

Circulation of BRF notes passes 500,000 copies per issue.



1988

Richard Fisher joins BRF and goes on to steer the charity through the next three decades of growth and change.



1999-2020

For just over 20 years Barnabas in Schools provides RE Days and INSETs, helping primary schools explore Christianity creatively.



2012-2018

Who Let The Dads Out? is part of BRF for a season — inspiring and resourcing churches to support fathers, father figures and their children in sharing faith together.


BRF centenary rose

Centenary classics and publishing highlights

In October 2021 we launched *The BRF Book of 365 Bible Reflections*, and during 2022 we will be republishing some old favourites, including a boxed set of *The People's Bible Commentary: The Gospels and Acts* in April 2022. Other much-loved classics include Simon Barrington-Ward's *The Jesus Prayer*, Brother Ramon's Lent book *When They Crucified My Lord*, Mike Coles' translation of well-known Bible stories into Cockney and Martyn Payne's seminal resource *How to Tell a Bible Story*.





The BRF Lent and Advent books for 2022 use the theme of sharing the story to reflect on these key seasons.

To complement *The BRF Book of 365 Bible Reflections* we will be publishing *The BRF Book of 100 Prayers* at the end of the year.
