BRF announces new lead for Messy Church

BRF is delighted to announce that the new ministry lead for Messy Church is Aike Kennett-Brown. Aike will take up her new role in January 2022 at the beginning of BRF's centenary year.

Aike Kennett-Brown

Aike has been involved with Messy Church since 2010, pioneering a volunteer-led Messy Church in south-east London. After completing her children and family ministry training at Cliff College in 2013, she moved to a paid Messy Church pioneer role and became south-east London Messy Church regional coordinator. Over a seven-year period the Messy Church grew a team of Messy Young leaders, held four weekend Messy Camps, took Messy Church to the local Parksfest and hosted Messy Munch, an intergenerational small group initiative. Aike wrote a paper about this discipleship experiment as part of her MA studies and presented her findings at the first International Messy Church Conference in May 2016.

Aike joined the diocese of Southwark in 2017 as mission support officer, championing, equipping and encouraging parishes in their ministry with children, young people and families. This included hosting Messy Celebrations at Southwark Cathedral, exploring Messy Communion and Baptism, and partnering with London Diocese to host Messy Prayer activities in Trafalgar Square for Thy Kingdom Come 2019. During 2020 and 2021 she enjoyed a part-time secondment with the national Church of England Growing Faith team.

She has also been part of BRF's Messy Church national support teams and is look forward to starting a Messy Church Goes Wild project in her local community.

Aike writes

'I am delighted to be joining the BRF team as Messy Church ministry lead. I look forward to meeting new and familiar faces, particularly at the third International Messy Church Conference in May 2022. I hope our gathering will provide encouragement for the wider Messy Church movement as we wade through this season of pandemic. God gave me three words for Messy Church as I fasted and prayed ahead of my interview: sustainable, intergenerational and discipleship. I look forward to exploring these areas together during this next season.'
