The key concepts at the heart of Christian faith can be hard to understand and articulate. We might think we know what sin, forgiveness, repentance and grace mean, but do we? In BRF's 2023 Lent book, Amy Scott Robinson brings shape and meaning to these abstract nouns by exploring the biblical images and metaphors which ground them in lived experience. She writes:

'This Lent, I hope that you will enjoy using this book to approach the concepts of repentance, sin, forgiveness and grace from some new angles, and arrive at Holy Week and Easter with a fresher, richer understanding of God's grace through the death and resurrection of Jesus.'

Each daily entry includes a Bible reading, reflection, prayer and prompt for reflection and action, and there are questions for group study.
