When I was part of the BRF Ministries morning of prayer last January, we were all very conscious of the challenges ahead for the charity. Like many other mission organisations we were wrestling with finances, staff changes and the need to reassess priorities. Like other charities we turned to God to ask for a renewed direction and for the resources they need.

There are plenty of Bible stories about the people of God facing impossible odds or challenging circumstances, and being forced to do what they, and we, should always do, namely put their trust – our trust – firmly in God. It was King Jehoshaphat, who said 'we do not know what to do, but our eyes are on you' (2 Chronicles 20:12).

So, as we look back and note how God has answered our prayers and look ahead to the challenges that are still there for BRF Ministries, we need to remember to focus not just on the difficulties but on the God who does not change.

God has bigger plans for us than we can imagine. Whether our situations look the same as this year ends or very different, is not what matters. God will still be God; Jesus will still be the same; and God will be doing a new thing because that's the way God is.

Thank you for joining us in prayer, as together we look up to the One who will supply all our needs through Jesus Christ our Lord.


