Prayer diary

Inspiring people of all ages to grow in Christian faith

'[The] disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1).

The followers of Jesus had watched him pray. They had heard the words he used and noted the places and times he chose to talk to his Father God. They wanted to pray like Jesus prayed and so they asked him to teach them.

There is no better school of prayer than this and no better words to use than the ones Jesus gave us in what we know today as the Lord's Prayer. As I was preparing this new prayer diary, I read through some recent BRF Ministries Bible reading notes and other publications. The Lord's Prayer came up again and again. It is the primal inspiration for our praying and a template for our prayers, as Chris Gillies writes in *On the Way to Work*:

'The Lord's Prayer provides a very helpful template around which to build more specific prayers about the daily situations we face. The practice of carving out time to pray alone is one that Jesus modelled. In praying things through with God, we cannot help but reflect on how God sees these situations. This helps us to discover fresh perspective, revealing alternative courses of action and more godly ways of dealing with things.'

Revisiting this prayer helps us deepen our own prayer life and I've woven its words from Matthew 6:9–13 through the entries

for each week in the coming months. Inspired by this, may you, with us, pray as Jesus prayed, for the work of BRF Ministries and for the staff and volunteers who are so grateful to have prayer supporters like you working alongside them every day.


